	Official letter or email from the Swiss universities requesting the legalization		
	Written personal statement, explaining the reason for the legalization and the contact information of the applicant

IMPORTANT: Only documents that are evidently related to Switzerland or Liechtenstein can be legalized by the Consulate General. Documents in connection with financial transactions cannot be legalized.

The decision on whether a legalization is possible or not can only be taken once all the required documents have been submitted. This Consulate General reserves the right to ask for additional documents and information if required.

Only official signatures and stamps or private signatures are to be legalized, but neither the documents itself nor its content.
