The year of 2022 saw high profile visits both in Georgia and Switzerland, which further underpins the ever strengthening ties between the two countries.



# The 30th Anniversary of Diplomatic Relations between Georgia and Switzerland

2022 saw an array of events organized by the Embassy of Switzerland under the aegis of the 30<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of Diplomatic Relations between Switzerland and Georgia.



Switzerland and Georgia celebrate this year the 30th Anniversary of Diplomatic Relations. In recognition of the solid partnership, the president of Georgia, Salome Zurabishvili, and the president of the Swiss Confederation, Ignazio Cassis, exchanged congratulatory letters.

To mark this important milestone in the bilateral relationship, the Swiss FDFA prepared an infographic which reflects the key aspects of cooperation in the course of 30 years.

# **Launching of the Swiss Cooperation Programme 2022-2025**



Within the framework of the 30<sup>th</sup> Anniversary, H.E. Heidi Grau, Ambassador of Switzerland to Georgia, and Danielle Meuwly, Regional Director of Cooperation, officially launched a new Swiss Cooperation Programme for the South Caucasus 2022-2025 on 19 May. The Programme is a flagship document which defines the key priority areas of Swiss engagement for the period of 2022-2025.

The focus of the Swiss engagement will be on four

key areas: 1) promoting civic engagement and cooperation in the region, 2) strengthening democracy and public institutions, 3) improving economic development and creation of decent jobs, and 4) strengthening climate resilience and sustainable resource management.





Switzerland is currently

supporting more than 20 projects. The new Programme 2022-2025 builds on past achievements and continues to make an effective contribution to the country's development pathways by initiating new projects in priority areas.



Supported by Switzerland and Norway, the Pan-Caucasian Youth Orchestra (PCYO) performed this summer at the Tsinandali Festival's 2022 edition in the historical Tsinandali Estate in Kakheti. The PSYO includes about 80 young musicians from the South Caucasus countries and beyond.

The PSYO was established by Tsinandali Festival in 2019 with a mission to build peace across the Caucasus and neighbouring countries through music and cultural exchange.

## President of the National Council, Irène Kälin visits Georgia



The president of the National Council, Irène Kälin, paid an official visit to Georgia from 10 to 12 October. In the framework of the 3-day visit, the President held meetings with the Prime Minister, the Minister of Foreign Affairs and her counterpart, the Chairperson of the Parliament.

The Georgian officials expressed their gratitude to Switzerland for its protecting power mandate, solid partnership and long-standing support through development programmes.

At the meeting, the Prime Minister stressed the importance of the SDC-funded projects focused on socio-economic and institutional transformation of Georgia. The parties touched upon the avenues of future collaboration and the importance of high-profile bilateral meetings citing the meeting between President of the Swiss Confederation Cassis and Prime Minister Gharibashvili on the sidelines of the UN General Assembly in New York in September (see President Cassis' Tweet below).



At the meeting with the Speaker of the Parliament, Shalva Papuashvili, the two sides discussed Georgia's progress in fulfilling the European Commission's 12 recommendations for EU candidate status. Following the meeting, Speaker Papuashvili and NC President Kälin led a joint press conference.

The meeting between Minister of Foreign Affairs Ilia Darchiashvili

and NC President Kälin focused on the potential for the development of mutually beneficial cooperation in such areas as economic relations, professional education, climate protection, and tourism.

The agreement will provide a general framework for all aspects of cooperation in the field of migration between Switzerland and Georgia and further boost the well-established relations. On 7-8 November, Minister of Education and Science Michael Chkhenkeli visited Switzerland. The Minister held an official meeting with the Federal Councillor, head of the Department of Economic Affairs, Education and Research (EAER), Guy Parmelin. The Georgian minister emphasized the partnership in the area of vocational education and training, and in particular, the invaluable support of the SDC to the education system in Georgia.

During his visit, the minister held meetings with the principal of the Bern University and the representatives of the EHL Hospitality Business School.

# The Mayors of Tbilisi and Bern exchange visits



In July, Tbilisi Mayor Kakha Kaladze and Bern Mayor Alec von Graffenried signed in Bern a Memorandum of Understanding shaping a new cooperation on, including but not limited to urban development, transportation, and culture. The two cities will also share experience in public safety and tourism. In September, Mr. Graffenried arrived to Tbilisi to meet his counterpart and discuss the status of implementation of the commitments stipulated in the signed MoU.

#### **DEVELOPMENT COOPERATION**

The official launch of the Swiss Cooperation Programme 2022-2025 was followed by the kick-off of a number of new projects and new phases of existing projects.



Around 15,000 children will benefit from improved water, sanitation and hygiene services in 60 schools.

SDC and UNICEF started a new project, which aims at improving water and sanitation infrastructure and standards in schools as well as raise awareness of children and school personnel on safe hygiene practices.



The new project "Democracy starts in schools" was officially presented in December. The project aims at increasing youth participation in decision-making through democratic citizenship education and practices in 20 pilot schools. It is implemented by the Council of Europe in partnership with the Ministry of Education and Science.



The launch of the new project "Strengthening Sustainable Political Culture among Georgian Political Parties" was marked with an opening of the School on Party Politics. The project aims at promoting value-based political culture and consensus building in Georgia. It will be implemented by the Georgian Institute of Politics.



Swiss Cooperation continues to support the Vocational Education and Training project which started in 2013. The third and last phase of the project will focus on youth education, public-private partnerships and modern technologies in Vocational Education and Training (VET). The project will be implemented by UNDP Georgia.

Below please see the infographic which reflects main palpable achievements demonstrated in concrete figures.

Swiss Cooperation kicked off a new ALCP2 project which stands for Market Alliances for Rural Development. The project creates new opportunities for additional income and jobs to rural inhabitants dependent on primary agricultural production. The project is implemented by Cooperation's long-standing partner – Mercy Corps Georgia.

The SDC started a new, second phase of the National Identification and Traceability System in Georgia. While the first phase established the system, the second phase of the project will improve sustainability of this system through building capacities of stakeholders to use it. The second phase will ensure the sustainability of the initiative.



MODERNIZING VOCATIONAL EDUCATION AND TRAINING RELATED TO AGRICULTURE IN GEORGIA (PHASE 2)

**Goal:** The 2nd phase of the project aimed at improving employment opportunities for rural population through better access to vocational education.

Duration: 1 September 2018 - 31 August 2022


The project is implemented by UNDP with funding from the Swiss Agency for Development and Cooperation.



The project facilitated the creation of the Skills Agency Georgia in 2021. The Agency is the first ever public-private entity based on the international model



The project fostered the partnership between the Swiss agricultural school Plantahof and the Swiss Agricultural School Caucasus based in Georgia. The partnership intensified further knowledge transfer from Switzerland to Georgia

# **Exchange visits**



In August, a delegation of the Ministry of Environmental Protection and Agriculture visited Switzerland within the framework of the Swiss-funded project 'Modernization of the Vocational Education and Training in Georgia'. The delegation got acquainted with the Swiss system of extension services, including agriculture development strategies and skills development of service providers.



The Vocational Skills Agency of Georgia (GeoSkills) visited Switzerland for a study tour to explore Switzerland's vocational education policies and to meet with Swiss counterparts for experience sharing. During their stay in Switzerland, the GeoSkills representatives got to know Switzerland's overall VET policy, including qualification development, role of work-based learning, private sector's participation in VET and student exchange and mobility programmes.

The insights gathered during the study tour will further inspire the Georgian VET system and help it develop in line with the needs of education and economy sectors in Georgia.



The students of the Swiss Agricultural School Caucasus underwent a two-week intensive programme provided by the Swiss college 'Plantahof'. Plantahof is the partner college of the school 'Caucasus' within the framework of the SDC-funded project "Modernizing Vocational Education and Training in Georgia".

#### **CULTURE**



In September, the Embassy of Switzerland partook in the Tbilisi International Festival of Literature. Supported by the Embassy, Writers' House and Pro Helvetia, the Georgian audience had a rare opportunity to attend two events – a meeting with a Swiss poet, Ariane von Graffenried and an evening dedicated to Max Frisch's "Questionnaire". Dr. Thomas Strässle, president of the Max Frisch Foundation, arrived to Tbilisi for this occasion.



The 23<sup>rd</sup> Tbilisi International Film Festival is another festival the Embassy of Switzerland partnered with. The festival programme included two Swiss movies: "The Line" by Ursula Meyer and "A Piece of Sky" by Michael Koch.

#### Marriage for all – Law reform on July 1 2022

Switzerland recognises and permits same-sex marriage since 1 July 2022. As of the same date, registered partnerships are no longer concluded in Switzerland.

If your marriage or partnership was registered abroad, it must be entered into the Swiss civil register by the proper authority in Switzerland. In order to do so, you need to submit certain documents to your Swiss representation.

## Introduction of the new Swiss passport family



The introduction of the new Swiss passport family took place on 31 October 2022. While the design is completely renewed, the functionality and the issuing procedure will remain unchanged. All previously issued passports will remain valid until the registered date.



#### **<u>VoteInfo</u>** application provides live voting results

The VoteInfo application developed by the Federal Chancellery, the Federal Statistical Office and the Statistical Office of the Canton of Zurich allows users to follow the results of the vote in near real time on voting Sundays. From midday onwards,

VoteInfo users have access to the results for their municipality, their canton and the whole of Switzerland. The FSO continuously updates the results of the votes automatically delivered by the cantons.
