Capacity Building in International Relations



Background

After the collapse of the Soviet regime, Armenia, Azerbaijan and Georgia were not adequately prepared for conducting foreign relations. The South Caucasus governments still need to build the capabilities of the civil servants, especially in *foreign*, political, and economical relations, and in particular in humanitarian laws and human rights applications, as well as in negotiation skills.
