## Vulnerable Household Rehabilitation in Zugdidi Region

| Georgia, a country in transition and suffering from the continuing unresolved<br>conflicts over South Ossetia and Abkhazia, faces serious socio-economic<br>conditions that almost half of the population still lives below the poverty<br>level. The Zugdidi district, bordering Abkhazia, hosts a substantial number<br>of internally displaced persons (IDPs) from Abkhazia. Whereas some IDPs<br>originate from the district of Gali, where the return for some is possible,<br>others are coming from different districts of Abkhazia where return is not<br>ever likely to take place in the foreseeable future.
