## Vulnerable Household Rehabilitation in Zugdidi Region

Georgia, a country in transition and suffering from the continuing unresolved conflicts over South Ossetia and Abkhazia, faces serious socio-economic conditions that almost half of the population still lives below the poverty level. The Zugdidi district, bordering Abkhazia, hosts a substantial number of internally displaced persons (IDPs) from Abkhazia. Whereas some IDPs originate from the district of Gali, where the return for some is possible, others are coming from different districts of Abkhazia where return is not ever likely to take place in the foreseeable future.
