	Background
B	Georgia is a highly disaster-prone country. In the past it has been frequently hit by major natural disasters like earthquakes, floods, droughts, landslides and avalanches. It is continuously exposed to a large number of technological and complex natural disasters.
	Georgia's current fragile social, political and economic environment, rapid urbanization, and the concentration of improperly maintained technical infrastructures greatly increase the level of the country's vulnerability, in addition to contributing in great measure to the severe impact of disasters. Georgia's institutional disaster management capacities are very limited in terms of disaster prevention, mitigation, preparedness and response.
