# Rural Development in Racha-Lechkhumi – phase II

# General information

Region: Racha-Lechkhumi (Georgia) Duration: February 2012-January 2015

Budget: CHF 2'500'000

### **Project partners**

#### **Project objectives**

Farmers and small rural enterprises in Racha-Lechkhumi have improved skills and capacities in the field of dairy and beef production. They achieve increased quality and volume of production and succeed in selling their produce.

The interaction between the farmer households, their communities and local self-government is enhanced and contributes to transparent decision-making with a participation of all stakeholders.

#### **Background**

The region is less vulnerable to natural disasters as the municipalities apply principles of disaster risk reduction and prevention.

The region of Racha-Lechkhumi is one of the most underdeveloped parts of Georgia, with the lowest population density of all regions of Georgia. As a result of continuous out-migration, the region's population has declined almost by half since the independence of Georgia. Arable farmland is limited and production is very low. There is a need for agricultural intensification and new methods to improve the quality and quantity of agricultural

production and strengthen and develop links to markets. To address this, the project applies a market development approach and works along the value chains which are most relevant for the impoverished and remote villages in the target region.

Racha-Lechkhumi is prone to landslides, floods, and erosion due to tetonic movements and seismic activities, which is aggravated by often unsustainable agricultural practise.

#### **Project activities**

The project's activities cover the following areas, mostly focusing on the municipalities of Ambrolauri and Oni

- Advisory services in the field of livestock breeding, dairy and beef processing and marketing;
- Demonstration plots to promote improved varieties and cultivation techniques for livestock feeding
- Support to providers of agricultural inputs
- Strengthening the system of veterinary services
- Support of producers' associations in the field of machinery and capacity building for entrepreneurship
- Matching grants for promotion of value-adding production, processing or marketing.

In the field of disaster risk reduction, the project supports municipal authorities and local communities to develop pasture management plans and provide small grants for community initiatives linked to the livestock value chains.

## **Project results**

The project also supports capacity building for a more successful lobbying of Racha's interests at the national level.

A total of 3000 farmer households in 37 communities benefit from advisory services or enjoy improved access to veterinary services and agricultural inputs. Participating farmers are expected to increase their incomes by 20 percent.

Support of service providers such as veterinary and agricultural input shops, help to stimulate the market dynamics in the livestock and mixed farming value chains.

6 new local dairy enterprises established with new techniques and have sustainable market access to sell their produce.

20 communities develop disaster risk and pasture management plans and benefit from improved small-scale infrastructure and better access to pastures for their herds.

2 retail outlets sell beef and dairy from Racha outside the region.
