During the official ceremony of the Swiss Nation Day at the Swiss Pavilion in Expo 2012 Yeosu on Mai 21, the Embassy presented the book "50 Years Switzerland-Korea" that commemorates half a century of diplomatic relations between the two countries. The first copy was handed over by Ambassador Thomas Kupfer to the Guest of Honor of the Swiss Day, Mr. Hansjörg Walter President of the Swiss Parliament.

Swiss Weeks in Seoul - a multifaceted program to experience Switzerland



Under the auspices of Presence Switzerland and the Swiss Embassy, a series of events known as Swiss Weeks in Seoul ran as a pre-program to the Expo pavilion and also as the start of the 50th anniversary commemorations of diplomatic relations between Switzerland and the Republic of Korea from February until May 2012. Primarily addressing tomorrow's opinion leaders and decision makers, the interactive programs offered an opportunity for Koreans to experience Switzerland in an interesting way. Swiss Weeks in Seoul featured various events in Swiss art, culture, design, sustainability and innovation, with the intention of introducing the diversity and less commonly known facets of Switzerland.



The <u>Design Prize Switzerland 2011 exhibition</u> officially kicked off its 2012 worldwide tour. It was held at the Sejong Center from March 22 until April 1 and at KT&G SangsangMadang from April 5 until May 6. Aimed at promoting Swiss design to international society and encouraging international dialogue and exchange with the Swiss design industry, the Design Prize Switzerland was originally initiated by the Design Center Langenthal in 1991. As nominees for the most important design prize in Switzerland, participants presented industrial, textile and media/communications design products proven to be innovative and commercially viable.



On April 3, 2012, the School of Management and Law of the Zurich University of Applied Sciences (ZHAW) and Sungkyunkwan University (SKKU) co-hosted a symposium combining lectures by leading Swiss and Korean experts under the title <u>Drivers of Green Innovation and Entrepreneurship: Korean and Swiss Initiatives in the New World of Business.</u> The event was an interactive platform where students participated in group discussions and idea competition to educate and inspire next-generation leaders in green innovation and develop a vision of sustainable entrepreneurship.



The last program of Swiss Weeks in Seoul was the <u>Swiss-Korean Innovation Night</u> held on April 18, 2012. Curated by Lift, one of the top three conferences in Europe on innovation and digital technologies, this was a pioneering and fun gathering of Swiss innovators and their Korean peers. Mostly involving up-and-coming leaders, artists, researchers and young professionals, the event gave an opportunity to explore prototypes and experience exclusive demos of state-of-the-art projects. All projects were presented in a unique set-up and project creators introduced their work through live interviews.

St. Moritz (Switzerland) wins bid for 2017 World Alpine Skiing Championships

On May 29 at the Korean ski Resort High1 took place the presentation of the candidacies for the World Championships in Alpine skiing 2017 in front of the FIS committee. Switzerland participated to this bid with the candidacy of the city of St. Moritz. In a pleasant and successful presentation, the two children of our consul Roland Grütter, Lea (10 years) and Marc (15 years) moderated the presentation and introduced representatives from St.Moritz, the sports ambassadors and champion ski racers Dominique Gisin and Marc Berthod, the chairman of the biding Committee Hugo Wetzel and Urs Lehmann, Director of Swiss Ski. The 12 minutes presentation "Live the Future" from the representatives of St. Moritz, was strongly applauded.

On May 31 the FIS Committee announced St. Moritz, Switzerland as the winner of the bid for the 2017 Alpine Ski Championship.
