#### ARRIVAL AND DEPARTURE

Ordinary and official passport holders are exempted from visa for their travels up to 90 days. Visa is only valid when the purpose of travel is tourism or commerce. For other purposes, such as work and study, visas are given by Turkish Embassies or Consulates. ### **HEALTH REQUIREMENTS**

Mandatory and recommended vaccinations: Vaccines are recommended for visitors to Türkiye include all normal childhood immunisations, plus typhoid, hepatitis B and hepatitis A. There are no WHO vaccination recommendations regarding Yellow fever and Malaria.

Mandatory medical insurance: Foreign visitors are advised to have medical insurance covering Türkiye. The standards of state hospitals and private health care institutions in major towns are good.

The time difference with Switzerland is +1 hour in summer and +2 hours in winter.

GMT+3 hours (April-September)

The voltage in Türkiye is 220-240 V with a frequency of 50 Hz.

Industrial: 400 380 volts; 50 Hz; 3,4 Number of wires (not including the ground wire)

Plugs: European round 2-prong plugs

Lamp Sockets: Screw type

#### **METHODS OF PAYMENT**

National currency in Türkiye is the Turkish Lira / TL. US dollar and Euro are also used at tourist shops and hotels for payment.

Exchange rate as of February 1, 2024: CHF 1 = 35.17 TL.

Exchange rates for Lira are quoted by the Central Bank (www.tcmb.gov.tr) and adjusted on a daily basis. TL is easily obtainable upon arrival in Türkiye at any exchange office or bank. There are ATMs throughout Türkiye, particularly in the big cities and around tourist centres. Credit cards (Visa, Master Card, and Dinners Club) and travel checks are accepted by most merchants and at hotels. Acceptance of methods of payment:

### **DOMESTIC TRAVEL, LOCAL TRANSPORT**

The most commonly used kind of public transport is Bus, Taxi, Dolmus (a van or mini-bus), tram and metro (in some major towns) are used for inner city transportation in Istanbul. The quality of the services is excellent. We usually recommend using metro or tram to avoid traffic.

Taxi fare for a 15 km journey: 250 TL / 7 CHF

Main ride hailing apps: Mobiett, Moovit, Istanbulkart, Metro Istanbul

Main method of payment for taxi and subways: Each taxi is equipped with a taxi-meter. Main method of payment is cash. For subway, Istanbulkart is used.

#### **ACCOMMODATION, TEMPORARY OFFICE SPACE**

Office spaces can be rented for short periods from several work spaces.

#### LANGUAGES USED FOR BUSINESS

The official language is Turkish. In business, English is the preferred language for communication. In tourism, German and Russian are most commonly spoken foreign languages which are followed by French, Italian and Arabic. Tips for initiating business contacts:

Scheduling Meetings:

Business dress code in Türkiye does not differ significantly from other areas of the world. As meetings, especially initial meetings, are seen as serious affairs it is probably safest for men to wear a smart suit with a tie and for women to wear a smart business suit with either skirt or trousers.

Greetings in Türkiye is not very different than any other countries. Business cards are commonly used, also some people started to use digital business cards.

Offering and accepting gifts and invitations:

Hospitality is very important in Türkiye, so gifts are also very common in the business world.

Sensitive topics:

Politics and religious practices are always very sensitive subjects in Türkiye because there are people with so many different opinions everywhere.
