

Change of name/surname in the United Kingdom and Ireland: entry in the Swiss civil status register

Documents to submit

□ Deed Poll

- Original
- Signed by a notary public
- The notary's signature must be certified by Apostille by the <u>Foreign & Commonwealth & Development Office (UK)</u> or <u>Department of Foreign Affairs and Trade (Ireland)</u>
 (paper version only; digital apostille or printed out digital apostille are not accepted)
- The original document including Apostille will be returned to you

copy of a valid identity document issued in the new name (e.g. copy of British passport)

Photocopies are not accepted. Additional documents may be required if necessary.

Legalisation

The Deed Poll must be legalised with an apostille before being submitted to the Swiss representation:

Apostille by the <u>Foreign & Commonwealth & Development Office (UK)</u> or <u>Department of Foreign Affairs and Trade (Ireland)</u>
 (paper version only; digital apostille or printed out digital apostille are not accepted)

Fees

Entry of the change of name/surname in the Swiss civil status register is free of charge.

Important information

Upon receipt of the relevant documents, we will translate and legalise the documents and forward them to the place of origin in Switzerland so that the family details can be updated in the Swiss central system (Infostar); this usually takes between 4-6 months.
